

Although the wind was blowing from the wrong direction for fast times in the final event of Abertillery Wheelers Saturday 10 miles series, competitors were near their best times for the course, which is comprised of two circuits using the new and old sections of the A472 road between Hafodyrynys and Popntypool,. With Clint Evans, the winner of the last three events, away on holiday, the first place was open to speculation. However, Martin Latewood riding his first time trial of the new season showed just how much he has improved since joining the club last year, by clocking 25m.38s. to beat off all opposition. Ian Davies 25-49, Ross Phillips 25-50, Gareth Chislett 26-24, Dave Evans 27-51, Brian Phillips 28-29, and Owen Pocock celebrated his recent 70<sup>th</sup> birthday with an excellent 31-41. When all members are competing in the weekly Thursday evening events, starting on April 14<sup>th</sup>, it is obvious this new version of the course will produce much faster rides than last year. The series of four Saturday events use members best two performances added together to decide the awards, and although absent from this latest event, Clint Evans is a comfortable winner with a total of 49m.26s., Ian Davies 50m.55s., Ross Phillips 52-03.
